BELMONT-HARRISON-NOBLE COUNTY BOARDS OF DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES

SERVICE & SUPPORT ADMINISTRATION - Service and Support Administrators (SSA) link people to what they need and want in their lives. Private providers deliver the supports and SSAs monitor them to make sure people are satisfied.

EARLY INTERVENTION - This statewide system provides coordinated supports in the home to parents of infants and toddlers, ages 0-3, with developmental delays and disabilities.

preschool & school-age - The County Boards support preschool and school-age students with disabilities in a variety of ways. This includes three integrated preschool classrooms at Harrison CBDD; Skill-Building for Transition, an IEP service in Belmont County; and partnership

COMMUNITY SUPPORTS - This family-focused service helps

grants to public schools in all three counties.

youth ages 3 to 18 acquire skills they need for their emotional well-being.

EMPLOYMENT NAVIGATION - This support helps young people, beginning at age 14, prepare for life after school by helping them develop their skills and find jobs.

ADULT SERVICES - Supports for adults begin at age 18, or upon graduation, and include employment, vocational training, adult day supports, and transportation through certified providers.

The Belmont, Harrison and Noble
County Boards of Developmental
Disabilities coordinate and fund
supports that help children and adults
live, learn, work, volunteer and thrive
in the community. Our commitment
can span a person's entire life as we
help each one achieve what matters
the most to them.

RESIDENTIAL - County Boards work with residential providers to develop housing options. This includes privately-owned homes, apartments and ICFs (*Intermediate Care Facilities for people with Intellectual Disabilities*). ICFs are funded through Medicaid and provide 24-hour care. At least four people live in an ICF. Waivers are funded through Medicaid and pay for services that people receive while living on their own, with family or other people in the community, instead of living in an ICF.

TRANSPORTATION – This service is offered by private providers and ensures people have access to the places they need and want to go.

24 HOUR EMERGENCY SUPPORT - The Board is available 24/7/365 to assist with emergencies or other health/safety issues. Call 740-310-2255.
